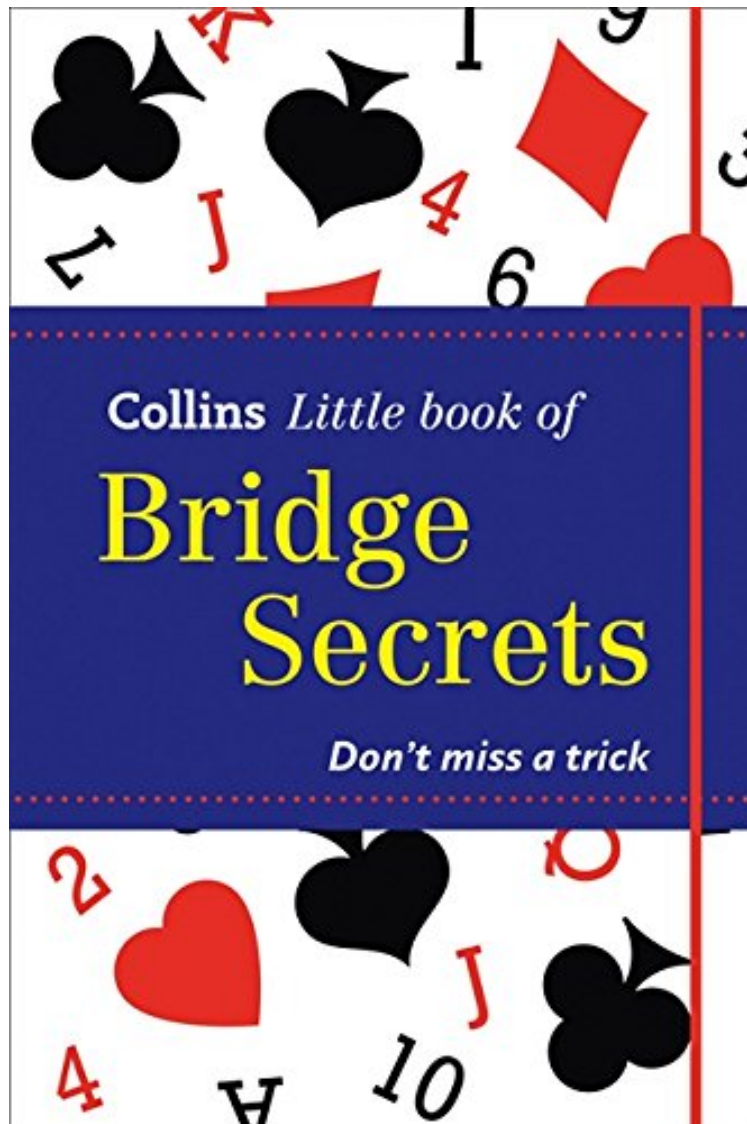

them. But even a player of intermediate experience will find a number of valuable points or clear explanation of a rule you may be aware of.
