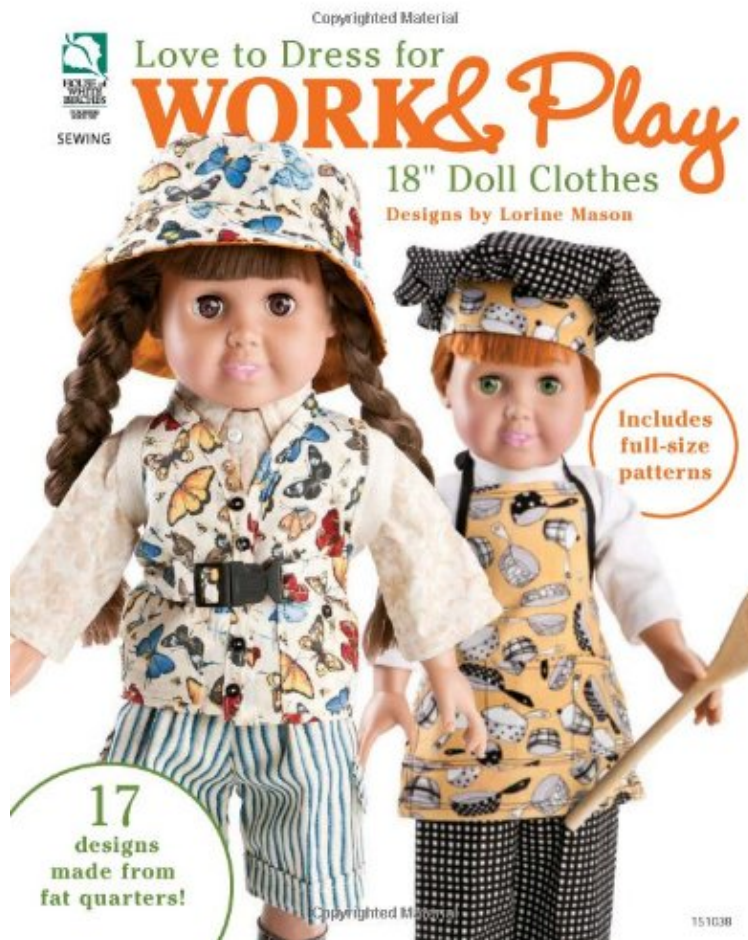

The patterns are easy, instuctions clear, but I do not feel they fit properly on the focus dolls. It seems like most 18" doll patterns hang on the chubby body of the cloth dolls that are most popular. While this pattern book may be a good quick way to make clothing for your kids dolls, the patterns lack the sophistication and fit of good American Girl doll clothing. I feel that with the proper patterns most people should be able to make clothing that matches or exceeds the manufactures clothing but this book falls short of that expectation. The fabric choices were very odd for each kind of outfit and maybe using fat quarters offers a wide selection of materials, but it is not the best choice to make clothing for young girl's dolls as they are 100% cotton and must be ironed if washed.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
