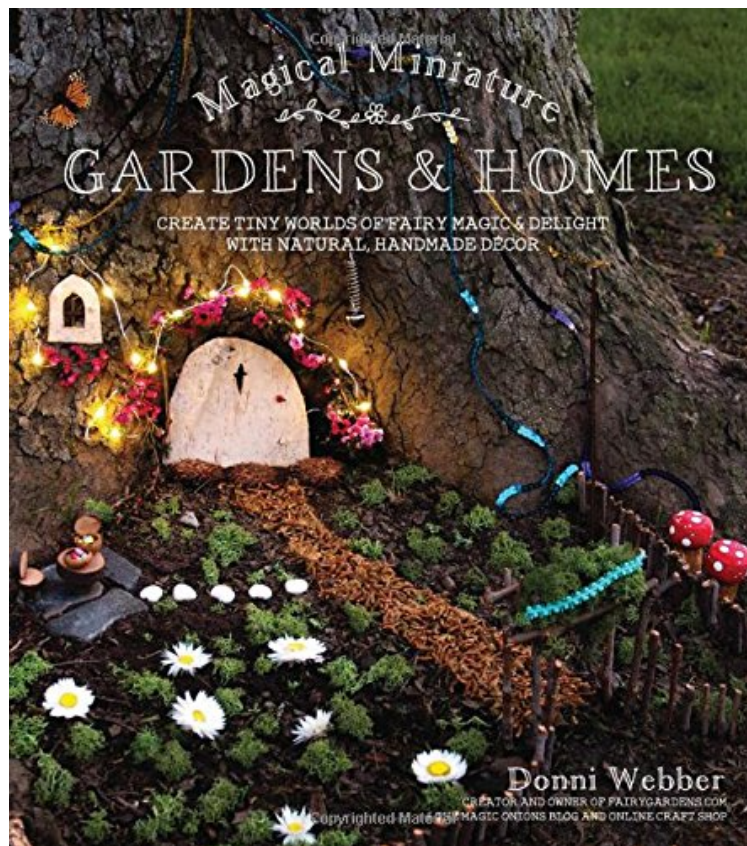

I am a terrarium maker, and this book shows how to make small wonders that are perfect for planted terrariums as well as for indoor and outdoor miniature gardens. Easy-to-follow instructions show how to make darling objects for your own miniature world out of found objects like acorns and pebbles as well as how to use ready-made things like mini-bricks and mini-lights to decorate gourd homes for fairies and tiny garden denizens. One of my favorite projects is an absolutely darling little chair made by twisting the wires of a champagne cork cage (and a great reason to go get a bottle of champagne). If you have those dang snails plaguing your garden, you can collect the snail

shells to make any number of cute little things like a miniature hanging shell planter or a clay snail. There are also directions for how to make your own miniature woven baskets, hammocks, spool chimneys and a myriad of tiny things for your fairy garden. This is a lovely book filled with designs and directions that will spur your imagination to create your own miniature objects. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Many or most are for indoors or less harsh climates than mine. I can see making a seasonal project out of these and taking them in for winter. The photography and instructions are very good. Although the final outcome will appeal to children, most of these are not exactly projects for children. Many of the tools needed should be used with care and supervision.
