One out of three is bad.The projects were indeed beautiful, but I found them to be complicated, not well documented and entirely difficult for the average crafter to recreate. I'm a beginner, and this book doesn't explain how to assemble signatures, etc. They just assume you already know bookbinding techniques. I recommend *Cover to Cover* for a good description of how to do basic techniques, and this book for the intermediate book maker who wants to make some beautiful art.
