Here we have a simple, clearly written, well illustrated book of rather dull and in some cases downright ugly dolls. I don't agree with the previous reviewer who thought that the ethnic dolls were not very nice - I think the author is an equal opportunity insulter - black, white, old, young, male, female, each has its poster child for an ugly doll in this book! In fact the black doll shown on the front cover is one of the the nicer dolls I think. What I find this book useful for is the basic patterns, which I think you should then take away and be more creative with.
