Look at the cover and you'll get an idea of the kind of fabric creations you'll discover inside the book. The cover on the book I received only shows the Queen of Hearts. Pretty darn faithful to the original drawings of this classic work. I personally love a challenge, but if you are looking for simple rag dolls this isn't the best choice. There are patterns in the book of thimble toys, presumably the [dor]mouse, and a March Hare puppet that might be easier to do, but the serious doll maker or craftster can't but be enthralled by the red and white queens, the white rabbit (in different costumes!) and tweedle dum and tweedle dee. There are two versions of Alice, one a rag doll, the other a paper version with telescoping neck -- still a very neat idea in and of itself, but I don't think either Alice is as intricate or inspired as the aforementioned characters. Only Alice, perhaps the thimble toys, and the March Hare could be thought of as suitable for a child to play with...but even then only for an older child who can appreciate the workmanship in the gift. I'm already thinking about how I might make changes to some of these simpler pieces to bring them to the level of the others, using some of the techniques of the first pieces. I'm beginning to suspect Ms. Hutchings intended to provide a range. In any case, this book really should be on the shelf of anyone who loves Alice

in Wonderland, vintage craft books, and serious doll-making. Grab one while you can. So, so glad I did!
