By Doro I love Tricia Guild's design and aesthetics, as well as decorating with flowers. I was hoping that this book would be full of ideas and beautiful pictures on how to decorate with flowers. To my disappointment, the book mostly concentrates on pictures of flowers instead of the design. There are too many close ups of flowers, flower petals, or things that are hard to describe because the pictures are so blurry. A lot of the photographs use diffused focus, so you end up looking at blurry pictures of flowers. To top it off, the book uses variety of paper, some of it is glossy, some of it semi-transparent, and a lot of it is just pure matte. Blurred up pictures of items on a super matte paper look like I printed them myself on my home printer using the save mode. They look very cheap. What I liked about the book, was advice on caring for flowers at your home and dreamy feel of some of the photographs. I guess the book is good for evoking serene mood once you get over the
