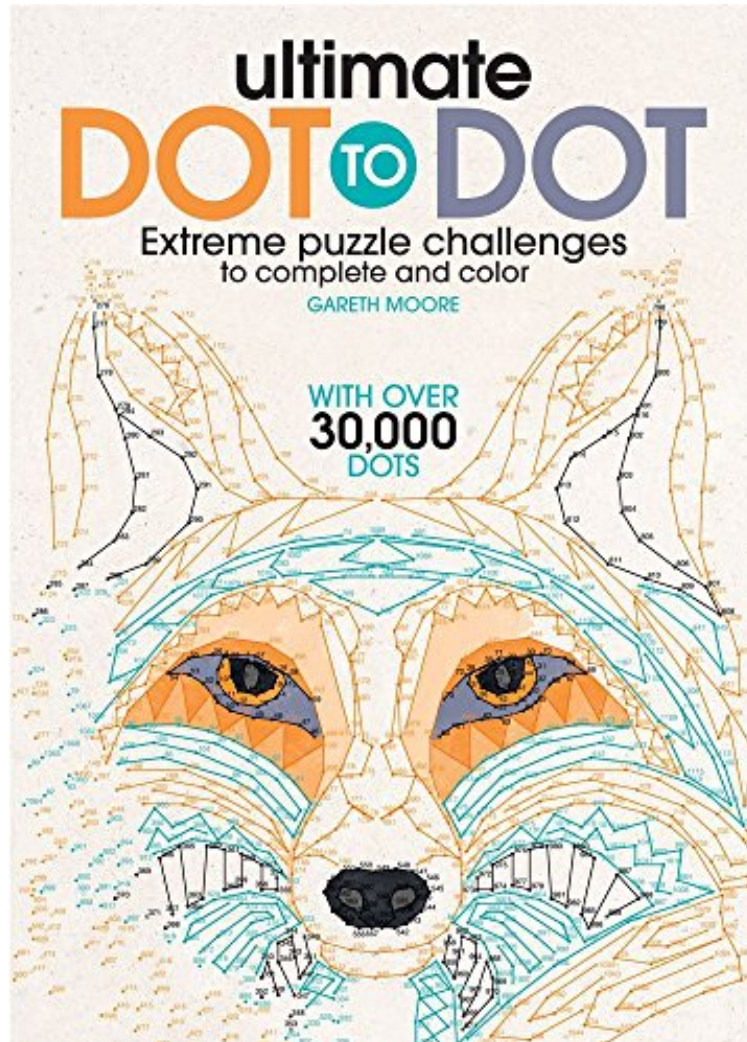

Instead of differentiating different lines with sequential numbers, lower case letters and upper case letters, there are multiple sequences of numbers differentiated with colors. 5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. The numbers are tiny because they have to be to accommodate the number of details. The difficulty is that they are also so

closely packed in the picture that I found it frequently impossible to know which dot goes to which number, and/or to connect the dots without crossing over another line, or crossing through another number (rendering it unreadable).. Instructions say that the dots are always either "directly above or to the side of a dot, or at one of the four main diagonals to it". This would be fine, except that the numbers are packed so very closely that it is extremely difficult to identify which is which for which number. 5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. I was surprised that my 8-yr-old, enjoyed it more than the 12-yr-old. They both, all but took the book from me while camping, as an activity while cut off from their screens for a few days. It has been a somewhat difficult book to get the hang of. There's no way of knowing when to make the line curve a little, or if it should be straight, but it did turn out to be a fun family activity that promotes learning for the littler ones to count that high and make straight lines etc. I hadn't done a dot-to-dot book since I was probably 12 myself, so it was neat. If you like adult coloring or the idea of it at least, you might like this as well. Keep in mind however, you will know what most, if not all, of the pictures are--so unlike a dot-to-dot as a kid, there is not much "surprise" of finding out what it will make.
