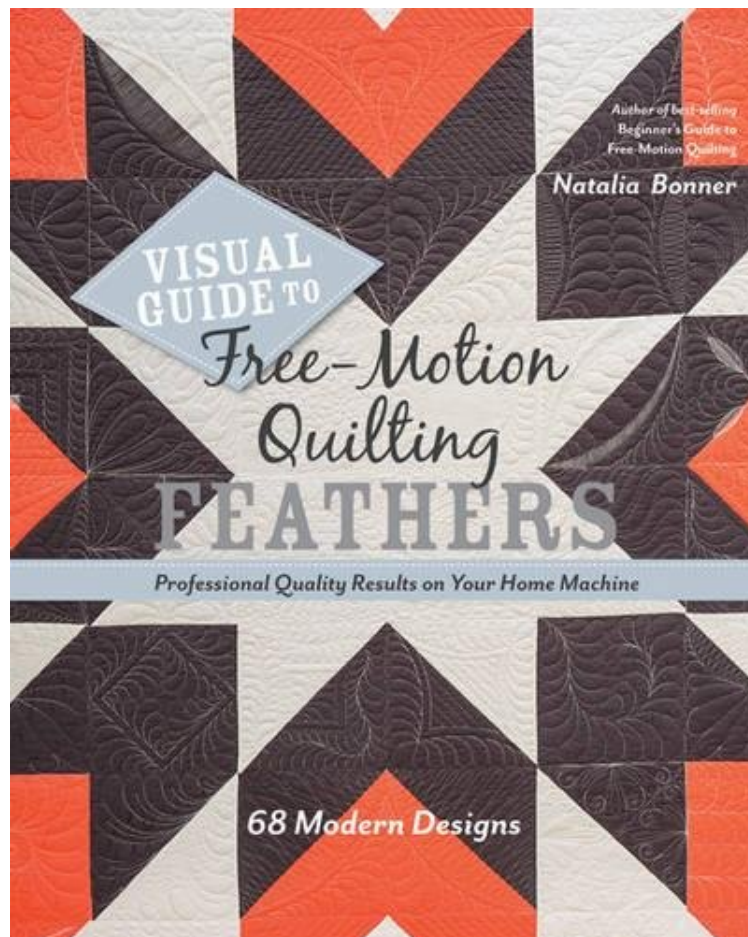

From what I gleaned, "modern" means less than a perfect feather...variations in the stitching prove that a person, not a machine, did the quilting. If that is the case, then my machine quilting is VERY modern at times. I must admit that my free-motion feathers often look a bit more like globs than feathers and I was hoping that this book was

going to help me better understand how to form the best looking feather but it did not. There are really just three pages devoted to feather constructions (single feather, bump back feather, and curly feather). Basically, those instructions were stitch the spine (no mention of curvature), go back to the bottom and stitch feathers up the right side start at the bottom again and stitch feathers on the left side. (Maybe that is part of the "modern"...you are supposed to wing it (pun intended) and figure out what feather YOU stitch that looks good to you.)The book has 143 pages. One thing I don't like about the book is strictly a failure on the publisher's part and that is the print font used throughout the step-by-step instructions in the book is very small. As if that wasn't bad enough, there are "tips" that not only have small font but they are a gray instead of black so they are even harder to see!
